





ADMISSION & ENROLLMENT

The Northwest R-1 School district has moved to an <u>Online Registration and Enrollment</u> system. All families with children in grades K-12, whether they are new or current, will register their student(s) online via the parent/guardian's Infinite Campus parent portal account.

The following must be followed for enrollment to be complete:

- Two documents from the list below need to be provided to complete the enrollment process
 - Mortgage Statement for Residence dated within 30 days of submission
 - Rental Agreement/Lease Unexpired & signed by landlord and tenant including the address, apartment number and date of rental.
 - o Deed for Residence
 - Closing Statement for Residence dated within 30 days of submission
 - Utility bill- gas, electric, water, sewer, cable or internet with name, current address and dated within 30 days of submission. Final or disconnect notices will not be accepted.
 - **Real Estate Property Tax Statement** with name and current address dated within 1 year of submission.
 - Federal court or state court documents with name and current address dated within 30 days of submission.
 - o **Proof of Homeowners Insurance** dated with 1 year of submission.

2. Birth certificate

(Kindergarten students must be 5 years old before August 1)

3. Immunization records as required by the State of Missouri

The Missouri School Immunization Law requires immunizations for all school children unless exempt for medical or religious reasons. Children without proper immunizations will not be allowed to enter school.

ATTENDANCE

Please review the attendance policy in the <u>NWR-1 K-5th Grade Student</u> Handbook.

Parents, please stay in contact with their school nurse if their child is ill.

Regular attendance is essential for your child's learning. Please call the school office by 9:00 a.m. at (636) 671–3330 to report your child's absence. All absences are recorded as documented or undocumented. If a child is absent due to an illness or doctor's appointment, please bring a doctor's note upon returning to school.

When an absence of more than one day is necessary, teachers will furnish homework if requested by the parents. When requesting work when your child is ill, please do so early in the day to allow teachers time to get the work together. Medical and dental appointments are necessary, but should be scheduled before and after school hours, if possible.

The class with the highest attendance percentage will be recognized monthly with a traveling trophy and class party. Students with perfect attendance for the entire year will receive a prize!

The district and building attendance goal of 95% is aligned with the state standard. It is imperative that your child be at school every day!

BIRTHDAY TREATS

Teachers should have advance notice if a parent wishes to recognize their child's birthday. Treats may be dropped off in the office and will be served at the end of the school day or at a time that best minimizes disruption to classroom instruction. Please provide store bought treats only — no homemade baked goods. **Invitations to private parties should be handled outside of school.**

BUS TRANSPORTATION

Please review the district Transportation Services policy in the <u>NWR-1 K-5th</u> Grade Student Handbook.

Riding a Northwest R-1 School District bus is a privilege and students must obey the rules and regulations. If a student chooses not to obey the rules,

parents will be notified using a Bus Misconduct Report. Violations of bus rules may result in students being denied transportation. Your child's safety is of the utmost importance. By working together, we can provide a safe ride and positive experience.

If a student is to ride a different school bus in the afternoon, the office must receive a parent phone call or note from the parent/guardian (available at the District website) for approval. All students will ride their regular bus home unless notification of a change is received in the office by 2:30 p.m. Students will not be permitted to call at dismissal to make other arrangements.

CONFERENCES

Fall Conferences are scheduled for all students in the evenings November 15–16, 2023. <u>Conferences are in-person and student-led!</u> This means that your child takes ownership of their learning by leading the conference, talking about their academic progress, and sharing their portfolio. Spring Conferences are scheduled in March on an as needed basis. Parents are encouraged to contact their child's teacher any time there is a need or concern to schedule additional conferences. SeeSaw is the best way to contact your child's teacher!

COUNSELING

When inclement weather or an emergency situation occurs that affects the closing of school or the starting/dismissal times of the Northwest R-1 School District, the schedule will be posted on the NWR-1 website www.northwestschools.net as soon as possible after the decision. We will also use SeeSaw and Blackboard to keep parents updated so please make sure you are signed up and we have your most current contact information. Please check the website for the exact dismissal time of each school. Please do not call the school. If a snow day announcement states it is an AMI day, students log-in and do their work virtually for the day.

When schools are closed due to an emergency or hazardous weather, appointments with parents or others and school-sponsored activities are also cancelled.

EMERGENCY DRILLS

Please review the district Safety policy in the <u>NWR-1 K-5th Grade Student Handbook</u>.

Earthquake, Fire, Intruder, Lock Down, and Tornado/Severe Weather drills are held on a regular basis throughout the school year. Evacuation maps are posted throughout the building and in each classroom. Children practice correct safety procedures and must be encouraged to remain calm and follow the directions of the teacher in charge. Students will not be dismissed from school during a "Tornado Warning", until an ALL CLEAR is announced. Students will be released only to their parents or other authorized adults.

GRADE REPORTS

Students receive a grade report for each of the four quarters of school. This, along with teacher contact, is to promote a process of continuous evaluation of student performance to inform students and parents/guardians of progress. Parents will access grade reports through Parent Portal.

Grading Scale for Kdg. - 5th grade:

- **4** In-depth inferences and applications that go beyond what was taught. Student, with relative ease, grasps, applies, and extends the key concepts, processes, and skills for the grade level.
- **3** No major errors or omissions regarding any of the information and/or processes (simple or complex) that were explicitly taught. The student, with limited errors, grasps, applies, and extends the key concepts, processes, and skills for the grade level.
- **2** Major errors or omissions regarding the more complex ideas and processes, but no major errors or omissions regarding the simpler details and processes. The student is beginning to grasp and apply.
- **1** Even with help, no/little understanding of skills.

HOMEWORK

Homework for young children should help them develop good study habits, foster positive attitudes toward school, and communicate to students the idea that learning takes place at home as well as at school. All students may be asked to do some homework. We appreciate your help and ask you to do the following:

- 1. Help your child set up a consistent, organized place to complete homework.
- 2. Help your child establish a consistent schedule for completing homework.
- 3. Encourage, motivate, and prompt your child, but do not sit with them and do the homework with them. The purpose of the homework is for your child to practice and use what they have learned. If your child is consistently unable to do the homework by themselves, please contact the teacher.
- 4. If your child is practicing a skill, ask them to tell you which steps are easy and which are more difficult. If your child is doing a project, ask what knowledge they are applying in the project. If your child is consistently unable to talk about the skills they are practicing or the knowledge they are using, please contact the teacher.

If it is necessary for you to take your child out of school, you will be required to remain in the front entry vestibule area while we bring your child to you. It is the responsibility of the legal guardian or parent to notify the office, in writing, regarding who may pick up their child.

LION CARE PROGRAM

Northwest R-1 School District provides supervised care of students before and after school at Cedar Springs Elementary. They are open for students starting at 6:15 a.m. and after school until 6:15 p.m. Enrollment for this program can be completed online at https://northwestschools.ce.eleyo.com. The Lion Care program will be in session when school is dismissed on scheduled early release days. Lion Care is not in session on days when school is canceled or dismissed early due to inclement weather. Please direct your questions to the Lion Care Office at (636)692-0504.

MONEY

When sending money to school (cash or check) for any reason, put it in an envelope marked with your child's name, teacher's name, and the purpose for the funds.

PERSONAL ITEMS

Please label clothing, lunch boxes and backpacks with your child's name. If your child returns home without an article of clothing, please ask your child's teacher to check the classroom and lost & found. At the end of the school year, all unclaimed items will be donated to a local charity. Items not directly related to instruction – such as cell phones, iPods, radios, video games, make-up, jewelry, toys, collectible cards, etc. should be left at home.

PHYSICAL ACTIVITIES

All students are expected to participate in regular school activities such as physical education classes and recess unless the school is given a written statement from a physician explaining limitations. Tennis shoes should be worn daily for these activities. If a child is restricted from participating in P.E.

they are also restricted from participating in recess.

All students are expected to participate in outdoor play activities and should be sent to school properly dressed for the weather. (Students will be kept inside for extremely hot/cold temperatures and inclement weather.) Generally, students who are well enough to be in school are well enough to be included in outdoor activities. If a student needs to remain inside at recess, a doctor's note is required.

PRIVATE TRANSPORTATION

Private Transportation drop-off is in the back of the building at the gymnasium entrance with staff supervision. Students ARE NOT to get out of the car until a teacher is on duty outside at 8:15 AM. Please do not drop students off in the front of the building.

Private Transportation pick-up is also in the back of the building at the gym with staff supervision beginning at 3:29. Please do not arrive for end-of-day private transportation before 3:28 as this causes dangerous traffic congestion on Rivermont Drive and 30 Highway!! ID may be required for verification at pick-up. You will need to fill out a Permanent Private Transportation Form if your child is end-of-day private transportation every day. Do not enter the building to pick-up your child at the end of the day. If you need to pick up and do not normally do so, a note must be sent with your child or you must call the office before 2:30.

<u>PTO</u>

Cedar Spring Elementary PTO is a parent organization that plans activities and events to encourage student & family participation and raise funds to purchase items that benefit our school. We hope you will get involved!

SPECIAL AREA CLASSES

Students participate in art, music, library, or PE classes daily. The weekly special area schedule is set except for a Wednesday rotation. In addition, students also participate in a 50 minute/week Tech Class. The expectations for special area/tech class are:

- Respectful: Respect self, others and school
- Responsible: Be prepared for class, participate and follow directions.
- Resilient: Give your best effort with a positive attitude & sportsmanship
- Ready: Be a learner who works collaboratively with others.

<u>ART</u> - Students in grades kindergarten through fifth grade receive scheduled instruction from the Art Specialist conforming to state classification guidelines. Each child is introduced to a variety of media and utensils and explores their multi-uses. This stimulates ideas, creativity, and problemsolving. Small motor skills are practiced and refined in sequential developmental experiences. Activities include painting, drawing, sculpture, ceramics, and two and three-dimensional work.

<u>LIBRARY</u> - The library provides instructional and recreational reading materials for all students at CSE. The librarian meets with every class at a scheduled time period weekly to give library skills instruction and encourage reading with lessons, stories, and activities. Students are also encouraged to visit the library before and after school to return and check out books.

- Books are checked out for a one-week period & may be renewed twice.
- Kdg-1st grade may check out one book at a time; 2nd-5th grade may check out two books at a time.
- A student will not be allowed to check out a new book until all overdue books are returned.

MUSIC - The purpose of the music program is to enrich the lives of our

students and give them the skills necessary to follow any musical avenue they desire. The music program is designed to develop the rhythmic, melodic, and listening skills through theory and creative expression. Students have the opportunity to sing, dance, and perform on a variety of classroom instruments.

<u>PHYSICAL EDUCATION</u> - Our physical education program gives children the opportunity to develop and maintain a level of physical fitness appropriate for his/her individual needs. Strong emphasis is placed on the basic skills essential to the development of sport skills. The physical education curriculum includes movement activities, rhythms, ball handling, gymnastics, stunts, tumbling, and lead-up games, which use basic skills of the various sports. Students are expected to follow all safety rules and take care of equipment. Students participate in their street clothes so attire appropriate for physical activity is required. Students must wear/bring tennis shoes on P.E. days. If a child needs to be excused from participation for any reason, a doctor's note is required from the parent/guardian.

TECHNOLOGY - The Information Technology Specialist will work with students through the usage of district provided Chromebooks. The students will learn the fundamentals of internet safety and etiquette. Keyboard skills will be introduced and honed through usage of the home row. Grade specific skills will be introduced and perfected through the use of Google Workspace and its applications. Age appropriate coding skills will be introduced and practiced and all students will be encouraged to explore the use of technology as a necessary tool for learning.

VISITORS

During the school day we welcome parents and volunteers to visit our school! All visitors must enter through the front doors and sign in at the office to receive a visitor's sticker. Please have your ID ready. Due to limited space in the cafeteria during lunch, if you come to CSE to eat lunch with your child, you and your child will eat in a designated classroom. We ask that pre-school age children not accompany parents unless it is for a lunch time visit as it can be very disruptive to the learning process and takes away from instructional time.

VOLUNTEERS

We are proud to have volunteers in our building and actively solicit your help in our school! Your special skills, talents, and help are needed. If you are interested in serving as volunteer, please let your child's teacher know and contact Chris Somervell at 636-677-3473.

All school volunteers that follow a regular schedule or are left unsupervised with students must complete a background check (FBI). This background check will ensure the safety and security of our students, which is our top priority. Please note, volunteers may not work in any school until the background check has been received by the District.

We ask that pre-school age children not accompany parent volunteers as it can be very disruptive to the learning process and takes away from instructional time. Please make arrangements to volunteer in advance. You need to sign the volunteer register and receive a visitor's pass in the office when you arrive.
